1	Completed Federal Acquisition Circular (FAC) which contains the proposed ARRA Federal Acquisition Regulation (FAR) changes published in the March 31 Federal Register.	DoD is preparing to begin awarding some contracts soon after the Federal Acquisition Circular (FAC) containing revised changes to the Federal Acquisition Regulation is published in the Federal Register. Some of these awards include the following Department of the Navy projects which may be awarded by the end of April: Facility Sustainment Restoration and Modernization projects : 1. Replace Elevators #37 and #40 Building 171, Norfolk Naval Shipyard, Norfolk, VA; 2. Replace Roof Mounted Boilers, Bachelor Quarters Building 3144 and Bachelor Quarters Building 3150, Naval Base San Diego, CA; 3. Advance Meter Installation, Various Locations throughout Washington State; 4. Replace HVAC and Modernize Board Hall Bachelor Quarters Complex, Buildings 30-34, Nava Station Great Lakes, IL; 5. Renovate Ground Floor HVAC, Bldg 100, NOSC Bronx, NY; 6. Parking Garage Repairs, National Maritime Intelligence Center, Suitland, MD;
