1	The Department of Defense (DoD) obligated \$325.3M during the week ending September 4, 2009, bringing the cumulative obligation of Recovery Act funds to \$2,416.9M. This includes \$1,923.4M for the Facilities Sustainment, Restoration and Modernization (FSRM) program which had new obligations of \$144.2M this week, \$369.4M for the Military Construction program which had new obligations of \$178.9M, and \$113.4M for the Near Term Energy-Efficient Technologies (NTEET) program which had new obligations of \$2.2M. Total obligations to date represent 32.2% of all DoD Recovery Act Funds received and reflect over 1,900 contracts to non-Federal vendors. Over 76% of contracts awarded were to small businesses (58% of contract dollars).	Continue to award contracts and monitor execution.
2	The \$178.9M increase this week in military construction projects was the result of contract awards on 9 projects for the Air Force totalling \$141.8M and 3 for the Army for \$22.6M. The Air Force projects are \$49.3M for replacement of family housing units at Eielson Air Force Base (AFB), AK; \$24.1M for a dormitory at Goodfellow AFB, TX; \$19.9M for dormitory replacement, Minot AFB, ND; \$14.5M for a dormitory at Keesler AFB, MS; \$11.2M for Child Development Center, Moody AFB, GA; \$10.3M for Child Development Center, Hill AFB, UT; \$8.0M for Child Development Center, Cannon AFB, NM; \$7.6M to replace the civil engineering maintenance complex, Ft. Smith, AR; \$6.3M for additions and upgrades to the Child Development Center at Lackland AFB, TX; and \$4.1M to add/alter the fire station in Forbes, KS. The Army awarded 3 contracts including \$11.6M for a Child Development Center, Ft. Hood, TX; \$7.9M for a youth services center at Ft. Stewart, GA; and \$3.1M for additions/alterations to the readiness center in Gassaway, WV.	Continue to coordinate the Interim Final Rule for the Expanded Homeowners Assistance Program with OMB. Publication in the Federal Register for public comment is expected in the next few weeks.
3	There were an additional \$144.2M in new obligations on FSRM projects for the week including \$41.2M for the Air Force, \$68.0M for the Navy, \$31.4M for the Army, and \$3.6M for Defense-Wide projects. New obligations for the Air Force include \$8.0M for audit and inspection of above ground storage tanks, Air Force Center for Engineering and Environment; \$7.2M for six projects at Vandenberg AFB, CA; \$5.9M for two projects at McConnell AFB, KS; \$3.3M for two projects at Ellsworth AFB, SD; \$3.1M for two projects at Tinker AFB, OK; and \$2.9M for four projects at Edwards AFB, CA.	Coordinate Contract and Grant Staffing Qualification Survey in accordance with the Recovery Accountability and Transparency Board.
4	FSRM projects that the Navy obligated this week include \$23.5M to install meters at Navy installations, CA; \$14.9M to repair/replace airfield lighting at Belle Chasse, LA; \$9.3M to modernize Angelley Hall bachelor quarters at Naval Station San Diego, CA; \$6.7M for two projects to repair runways and taxiways at Naval Air Station Corpus Christi, TX; \$3.9M to replace the heating, ventilation and air conditioning unit and modernization of building 343 at Portsmouth Naval Shipyard, ME; and \$3.4M to repair dry dock caissons at Naval Base Kitsap, WA.	
5	Army FSRM obligations for this week included \$4.4M to repair the Moline Bridge at Rock Island, IL; \$1.4M to repair a Child Development Center at Ft Knox, KY; and \$1.4M to repair Battalion HQ buildings at Ft Stewart, GA.	
6	Near Term Energy-Efficient Technologies projects for this week included Navy obligations of \$2.1M associated with the DDG-51 fuel optimization project and Army obligations of \$0.1M for small business inovative research .	
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
